# Franklin County Dog Shelter Leadership Updates

 Nothing new to report other than all staff are in uniforms and system is going well; No changes to the foster program since last report

### Shelter Stats for Jan 1 - Aug 10, 2020 (website stats link)

- Total Impounded 1967 dogs, 2938 last year
- Owner surrender: 289 current/407 last year
- Returns: 267current/529 last year
- Strays: 789 current/974 last year
- Total Incoming: 3740 current/5439 last year, (1699 difference)
- Adopted: 1812
- Euthanized: 581 current/ last year 931
- Reclaimed by owner: 835 current/970 last year
- Transferred out to rescue: 219
- SNYP-It Program: 386 current/477 last year (None in April)
- Adult dog length of stay- 8.2 days average
- Puppy length of stay 5.3 days average
- 94% live release rate for the year

- 1. Last August Nutmeg Heartworm/ update discouraged about the response from shelter community only found flyer from Florida with information on heartworm cases. Wants the shelter to be more proactive with this initiative. Mosquito outbreak.
- 2. Huskies being sent to the shelter. Wanting to make sure that people adopting are aware of proper care.
- 3. Uniforms the warden uniforms have not changed, recommend looking like rangers from Metroparks; similar with design on van
- 4. Knowledge of shelter conduct and concern on anticipated large number of evictions of residents and dogs may be released (economic distress plans to assist families) Detroit, MI: article on reports of increase in Parvo cases- attributed to be afraid of leaving home during COVID and because of financial challenges
